However, if you think you are entitled to benefits under the Scheme **but have not recently been contacted by the Trustees**, and you worked for Raleigh UK Limited, on a permanent basis, at any time between 1st October 1987 and 31st December 2002 and made contributions into the Scheme, please contact the Trustees via the Scheme's website giving brief details of your employment record with Raleigh UK Limited together with name, address, and contact details. Beneficiaries should make claims as set out above not later than 2 months from the date of this notice. As noted above, the Trustees are in the process of securing benefits with an insurance company for the members and beneficiaries of the Scheme. Therefore, the Trustees want to ensure that their records include all members and beneficiaries so that the correct benefits are insured. If the Trustees do not hear from you, they will proceed with the insurance of the Scheme's benefits, having regard to the claims and interest of which they have received notice.
